Recovery After Exit from Pandemic

Almost all organizations whether cooperatives were affected when the Covid-19 Pandemic struck to the whole world. Small, medium and some large cooperatives have to close down and some reduce their operations to the point that their surplus or profit were greatly affected. On top of this inflation shoot up due to elevated price of oil and food prices. One time a member of our cooperative approach me and inquire "Chairman why is it that we are bigger now but the rate of interest on share capital or dividends were declining unlike before where our dividends ranges from 8% to as high as 10%.

I have to explain to them that the Pandemic and the war between Ukraine and Russia very much affected our operations, notable of which are as follows:

- (a) There are few borrowers
- (b) Majority of existing borrowers were delinquent
- (c) We temporarily stop charging penalties
- (d) Others requested for loan restructuring etc.

In addition to this inflation shoot up so that prices of commodities went up thereby affecting the capacity of members to pay their loans and our cost of operations were also affected. It is fortunate that we still managed to at least maintain a profitable operation and attain our yearly surplus budget. The second semester, we hope our operations will normalize so that we can

attain our budgeted surplus of P103 Million and assets of P 4 Billion for the year 2023.

General Assembly of Federations

We attended the General Assembly of various federations such as Central Luzon Region League of PFCCO, Bulacan Federation of Cooperatives, One Cooperative Health Federations and from their assessment of the future, they are all optimistic that after this pandemic, our operations will surely improve and all our goals will be achieved with flying colors.

Five-Year Plan of San Jose Koop

In our annual report for the year 2022, we presented our 5-Year Plan beginning 2023 – 2027. To make our vision more concrete, we restated that for 2023 to 2027, our vision will be a "A World Class Financial Institution Committed to Serve with 146,000 Members, Share Capital of P1.6 Billion and Assets of P7 Billion."

The Pandemic Era was the biggest challenge we have met in our operations and surviving this era makes us strong and resilient ready to face the future with vigor and full of confidence that we will surpass our previous performance with flying colors.

LACTATION STATION AT SAN JOSE KOOP

Last May 2023, San Jose Koop celebrated its 36th Anniversary as a committed institution in uplifting the lives of the members as well as the community. As part of this celebration after the Thanksgiving Mass on May 15, 2023, we were all gathered for the blessing and to formally open the Lactorium also known as the Lactation Room of the cooperative located at the 2nd floor, Main Office.

This private space is intended for nursing and breastfeeding mothers that can be utilized by members and employees. San Jose Koop adopts the national policy of promoting, encouraging and protecting the practice of breastfeeding by having this kind of facility. It shall create an environment where basic physical, emotional and psychological needs of mother and infants are fulfilled and relationship are enhanced through breastfeeding.

Our Lactation Room is provided with complete equipments such as refrigerator as storage for expressed milk, lavatory, cleaning supplies, table and comfortable seats. Breastfeeding women need to breastfeed or pump breastmilk regularly during the day as it maintains milk supply and avoid medical problems related to a build-up of milk as well as it contains benefits and nutrients that need to be intake by the infants.

As the Breastfeeding Awareness Month approaches this month of August, San Jose Koop Raises awareness on the importance and to further promote breastfeeding. We have to be an advocate in establishing and incorporating specific measures in the cooperative that would present opportunities for mothers to continue expressing their milk and/or breastfeeding their infant or young child.

FLOWER ARRANGEMENT Seminar-Workshop

The Basic Flower Arrangement Seminar-Workshop was held last June 16, 2023 at the training room of San Jose Koop Main Office. It was attended by 22 regular members composed of 2 males and 20 females. The Resource Speaker invited is Ms. LORNA G. FLORES from TESDA.

Ms, Flores discussed the original art of flower arrangement originated from Japan that symbolizes beauty of all components of the natural world working in harmony. It is also known as Ïkebana" that symbolizes three main points, the heaven or sky, man and earth. She also introduced the basic materials used such as floral foam, scissor or cutter, flower vases, plastic twine, floral foam, ribbons, accessories to enhance better the said arrangement. Likewise, she identified the names of the flowers, color combination of big or small such as anthurium, mums, roses, and leaves to be used depends upon the arrangement designed.

She also discussed that flower arrangement should be balance to all the corners, scatterred the flowers depends upon to be use for a purpose like low and long flower arrangement for presidential table of speaker or wedding, round center piece can be use for a debut or wedding to be place on the table of the guest attendees. The mechanics should covered by inserting fillers of small leaves. Grouping of color of flowers or combination of colors is acceptable. Focal point is also important to emphasized at the center.

There are five arrangement designs demonstrated by Ms. Flores namely Round Center Piece, Long and Low, One Sided, Arm Bouquet and Bridal Bouquet. The participants divided into 4 members and grouped themselves. The five group names created are Group1-Shagedy, Group 2 – Bukang Liwayway, Group 3- Power Puff, Chair Group 4- Flower Five and Group 5- Flower Blossom.

After each actual demonstrated of Ms. Flores the members was given materials and the perform actual workshop with a group effort symbolizes "Cooperativism". The facilitators were Ms. Mikas L. Manuel and Ms. Lorie Ann Lozano who assisted the participants in their activities. They were guided by a pattern flower designed made by Ms. Flower to make it easier. Each flower arrangements was judged/constructive critisized by Chief MSBDO Officer Mr. Rodolfo Z. Gado and Education Committee Chairperson Mr. Jerry L. Ocampo respectively. It was observed that the participants were improving as the flower arrangement and were very artistic, imaginative skills to make their arrangements unique, authentic and a different one.

Each group and individual participants who were outstanding in the flower arrangement output were given a Certificate of Appreciation. The following groups were awarded for their best flower arrangement as follows: Round Center Piece – Flower Puff Group, Long and Low – Flower Blossom, One-Sided – Bukang Liwayway Group.

On the other hand, the individual participants who won the best for their flower arrangement is Ms. Jo Ann Glaze, for Arm Bouquet, and Ms. Maria Aurora Poblete and Ms. Eliza Alegria respectively won for Bridal Bouquet category.

It was indeed a very productive of the members of cooperative where their skills, talents were enhanced that can help to uplift their socio-economic livelihood which is one of the mission of San Jose Koop to serve and empower the members thru community services and conducting seminars and workshops. Together we are stronger.
